Gary Heise | Main Exhibit Gallery

Gary Heise will exhibit his watercolors during the month of September. Soon after graduating from the Rhode Island School of Design in 1983 (BFA-Painting), Heise took a series of classes in the basics of Chinese traditional painting with the Taiwanese painter and printmaker, Liao Shiou-ping. Studying with Mr. Liao enabled him to integrate Chinese painting techniques into his own watercolor work. Heise's watercolors depict the landscape using Chinese painting materials (ink, brush, and Chinese papers) and a combination of both Eastern and Western painting techniques. Gary is inspired by a personal experience of the landscape; from local Rhode Island scenes to imaginative, semi-abstract landscapes.









Alissa O'Brien | Friends Wall

Alissa O'Brien will be exhibiting wood burned artwork through the month of September on the Friends Wall. O'Brien studied Natural Science Illustration at Rhode Island School of Design. She has also participated in art festivals throughout Rhode Island and Massachusetts and currently exhibits in a few galleries.

Recently, O'Brien made a connection with the Thoreau Society and will be having a solo art exhibition in the upcoming year, where she will be creating art from the discarded wood of trees from Walden Pond. She also contributes to their publication which will soon be featuring ink drawings of nature, illustrating excerpts from Thoreau's journal.







About the Exhibit

"The art I will be presenting are examples of wood burning/pyrography. The wood I use is from wood collected from landscape jobs I have worked on, from trees around Concord, Massachusetts, and have been milled by the arborist I work with. I choose pieces of wood that

best supported an image of nature I have in my mind I wish to create, or the wood grain tells its own story and I create the image it reveals. The collection of art I will be exhibiting at the Greenville Library showcases quiet events of nature found in my yard and neighborhood. This art is of ordinary but wonderful events of nature found in the suburbs, that go unnoticed unless one slows down, detaches from the hustle and bustle of modern day concerns, and experiences the need to take a pause and look closely at the natural world happening all around." - Alissa O'Brien


